## Foghlam tro Mheadhan na Gàidhlig Gaelic Medium Education



There are many benefits to bilingualism and Gaelic Medium Education. Many studies have found that bilingualism enhances cognitive performance and helps children to become creative thinkers and successful problem solvers.

By Primary 7, Gaelic Medium children are fully proficient in Gaelic and English. Learning through two languages, strengthens their understanding of grammar, syntax and how language works.

Data shows that being bilingual helps in the learning of additional languages and enhances career prospects and access to university.

When children enter into Primary 1, they are fully immersed in the Gaelic language. Initially, all lessons are conducted through play, stories, traditional song, rhyme, games, art and short projects. This very successful model has shown that children become confident and comfortable with Gaelic before moving on to more formal methods of teaching.


## Rèis Dùthchail Leòdhais agus na Hearradh Lewis and Harris Cross Country Race 3
