



#### BEST START FOODS

- . This is a pre-paid card that you can use to buy healthy foods for children under 3
- You can apply when you are pregnant or at any time up until your child turns 3
- The payments are:
- £21.20 every 4 weeks during pregnancy
- . £42.40 every 4 weeks from your child being born until they're 1 year old
- £21.20 every 4 weeks between the ages of 1 and 3
- · You can use this card in any shop which accepts Mastercard
- You can use the card to buy eggs, milk (cow's milk and infant formula), fruit, vegetables and pulses (fresh, frozen, tinned or dried)

#### NHS MINOR AILMENTS SERVICE




 This is an NHS service for children, people aged 60 or over, people who hold a medical exemption certificate and people of certain benefits

 When you are registered for the Service your pharmacist can give you medicine for your child for a minor illness or complaint if they think you need it. You will not have to pay for this.

All children under 16, or under 19 and in full-time education, are eligible to register

#### **Child Disability payment**

Child Disability Payment provides support for the extra costs that a disabled child might have. Child Disability Payment replaces Disability Living Allowance (DLA) for children and young people living in Scotland. You can apply for Child Disability Payment for a disabled child under 16. The disability can be mental or physical. You can apply for Child Disability Payment if the disabled child does not have a diagnosis. In such cases, you can tell Social Security Scotland about: • how they're affected • any symptoms they may have Social Security Scotland will pay Child Disability Payment until the child is 18. They can sometimes continue making payments after the child is 18.


