Free School Meals / Assistance with School Clothing

Applications Free School Meals & Clothing Grant are now open for the term August 2024 – June 2025. Applications can be submitted via: Forms (cne-siar.gov.uk) Please ensure that you have all the necessary supporting documentation ready prior to submission.

Free School Meals

From the 1st of April 2023, Free School Meals are granted to children from families in receipt of:

- Income Support
- Income-based Job Seeker's Allowance
- Any income related element of Employment and Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, but not Working Tax Credit, with an income of less than £18,725
- Both Child Tax Credit and Working Tax Credit with an income of up to £8,717
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Universal Credit with a monthly earned income of not more than £726

Clothing Grant

Amounts paid for Clothing Grants are:

- £120 Per Primary Pupil
- £150 per Secondary Pupil

Assistance with School Clothing

Comhairle Nan Eilean Siar has adopted as Council policy the following procedures in relation to the assessment of clothing grant applications:

- Children of families who receive Income Support.
- Children of families who receive Employment and Support Allowance (ESA) income related.
- Children of families who receive Income Based Job Seekers Allowance.
- Children of families who receive Child Tax Credit and Working Tax Credit with an income below £20,000.
- Universal Credit (where the monthly earned income does not exceed £610).

Aodach Sgoile School Uniform



FINANCIAL HELP FOR PARENTS & CARERS

ARE YOU ENTITLED?



TAX FREE CHILDCARE. This is a Government.

- TAX FREE CHILLOCARE.

 This is a Government scheme to support working parents with childcare costs. You set up an online account which you can use to pay your childcare provider directly. For every £5 you pay in the Government will pay in a not size £2.

 You can get up to \$2000 per child per year, or \$4000 if your child is disabled. You can use this account to pay registered Childriniders, Nurseries & After School Clubs

 YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE IF:

The child you are applying for usually lives with you

BEST START GRANTS

- is a package of 3 new Scottish benefits to help parents on low incomes with costs of having a child.
- BEST STAK' I STAKE'S

 This is a package of 3 new Sootish benefits to help parents on low incomes wen
 the costs of having a child.

 The Pregnancy & Baby Payment is a one-off payment of £754.65 for your first
 child, then £377.35 for any younger siblings, to help with the costs of having a
 budgety Learning Payment is a one-off payment of £314.45 to help with the
 costs around the time your child might start nursery

 The School Age Payment is a one off payment of £314.55 to help with the costs of
 having a child starting school.

 You can apply whether you are in work or not.

You will be automatically eligible if you are under 18, or are 18 or 19 and in full time education or training and dependent on someone else who is claiming child benefit, child tax credit or universal credit for you

BEST START FOODS

- IEST START FOODS

 This is a pre-paid card that you can use to buy healthy foods for children under 3
 You can apply when you are pregnant or at any time up until your child turns 3
 The payments are:
 22:120 every 4 weeks during pregnancy
 24:2.40 every 4 weeks from your child being born until they're 1 year old
 22:120 every 4 weeks between the ages of 1 and 3
 You can use this card in any shop which accepts Mastercard
 You can use the card to buy eggs, milk (cow* milk and infant formula), fruit, vegetables and pulses (fresh, frozen, tinned or dried)

YOU MAY BE ELIGIBLE IF YOU ARE IN RECEIPT OF ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

Pension Credit

Housing Benefit and earning no more than £358 per week

Child Tax Credit and earning no more than £18,825 per year

Child Tax Credit and Working Tax Credit and earning no more than £8,717 per year

Scottish Child Payment helps towards the costs of supporting your family. It's a weekly payment of £26.70 that you can get for every child you look after who's under 16 years of age. You'll get the payment every 4 weeks if your application is successful.

You may be eligible if you are in receipt of one of the following:

Universal Credit

Child Tax Credit

Income Support

Pension Credit

Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance (JSA)

Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)

Working Tax Credit

NHS MINOR AILMENTS SERVICE

- This is an NHS service for children, people aged 60 or over, people who hold a medical exemption certificate and people of certain benefits. When you are registered for the Service your pharmacist can give you medicine for your child for a minor illness or complaint if they think you need it. You will not have to pay for this.

All children under 16, or under 19 and in full-time education, are eligible to register

To register for the service speak to your local pharmacist or call the NHS Inform Helpline on 0800 224488



WARM HOME DISCOUNT SCHEME

Child Disability payment

Child Disability Payment provides support for the extra costs that a disabled child might have. Child Disability Payment replaces Disability Living Allowance (DLA) for children and young people living in Scotland.
You can apply for Child Disability Payment for a disabled child under 16. The disability can be mental or physical.
You can also apply for Child Disability Payment if the disabled child does not have a diagnosis. In such cases, you can tell Social Security Scotland about:

• how they're affected
• any symptoms they may have
Social Security Scotland will pay Child Disability Payment until the child is 18.
They can sometimes continue making payments after the child is 18.
